<p><u>Colour Hunt</u>—Search around the house for items that are a certain colour <i>or</i> collect items in advance and see if your child can sort the items into colours.</p> <p>Start easy with sorting just 2 colours and make it more challenging by sorting more.</p> <p>Symbols attached to support visually.</p> <p>Rainbow write numbers (see language, literacy and communication)</p>	<p><u>Reading</u> - Book of the Week 'Wow said the owl' https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=liBRISRuV78</p> <p><u>Writing</u></p> <p>Rainbow writing/mark making</p> <p>Rainbow tray</p> <p>Your name and the names of colours over and over in the colours of the rainbow.</p> <p>Idea: do this outside with coloured chalks/on paper with felt tip pens or paints.</p>	<p><u>Fine Motor Skills</u></p> <p>Rainbow loop threading</p> <p><u>PE</u></p> <p>Try and make an obstacle course in the house or a sensory walk outside using chalks.</p> <p><u>Sensory/Relaxation</u> -</p> <p>Make a ribbon wand</p> <p>Rainbow blowers</p>

<p>Create a rainbow to help us make our school 'Thank you NHS' song this week.</p> <p>See ideas below:</p> <p>Sing the rainbow song together https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=yLpEGM34Fic</p>	<p><u>Science</u></p> <p>Colour mixing - use food colouring to make coloured water. Use a pipette (calpol syringe) to mix the coloured water to see if you can make different colours.</p> <p>Idea—if you have a water tray in the garden try this on a larger scale using empty pop bottles and funnels!</p> <p>Try freezing coloured water and putting it on a tray to melt. Talk about what is happening when the colours mix.</p> <p><u>Healthy Eating</u> Eat a rainbow—make fruit kebabs</p>	<p><u>History</u></p> <p>Take photos throughout the week of your activities. Look through them together and talk about what you have done.</p> <p><u>Geography</u></p> <p>Colour Hunt exploring the house or out in the Garden</p>
