

What Is the Harvest Festival?

Harvesting is when crops and food are picked and gathered. The food is harvested either by hand or using tractors. The tractors are big and able to harvest the grains, fruits or vegetables much quicker than by hand. A Harvest Festival is a celebration of the food grown on the land and it is celebrated all around the world.

When Is the Harvest Festival Celebrated?

In Britain, Harvest Festivals are traditionally held annually, on or near the Sunday of the harvest moon. This is the full moon that happens closest to the 23rd of September.

Why and How Is It Celebrated?

Harvest Festivals are a time when people are thankful for the crops which have been safely harvested. Christian people thank God for the food grown and for everything that helps the crops grow.

In Britain, Harvest Festivals are often celebrated in churches by bringing baskets of food to give thanks to God. People enjoy singing, praying, listening to stories and decorating the church.

Did You Know...?

In the past, it was not as easy to find food in the winter. It was very important that farmers brought the harvest in before the cold winter came so that there was enough food until the spring.










How Is Harvest Celebrated around the World?



1. North America and Canada

In Canada and North America, harvest is known as Thanksgiving. It occurs in October or November and is a public holiday.

2. West Africa

In West Africa, the Festival of Yams is held. It celebrates the harvest of yams, which generally takes place in August. Yams are a vegetable, similar to a sweet potato. People celebrate by dancing and sharing yams with the village.

3. China

In China, people celebrate the Harvest Moon Festival. They believe the moon is the brightest at this time of year so it is the best time for harvest and to gather with friends. Families enjoy picnics and different kinds of mooncakes. Children enjoy brightly lit lanterns and puppet shows.
